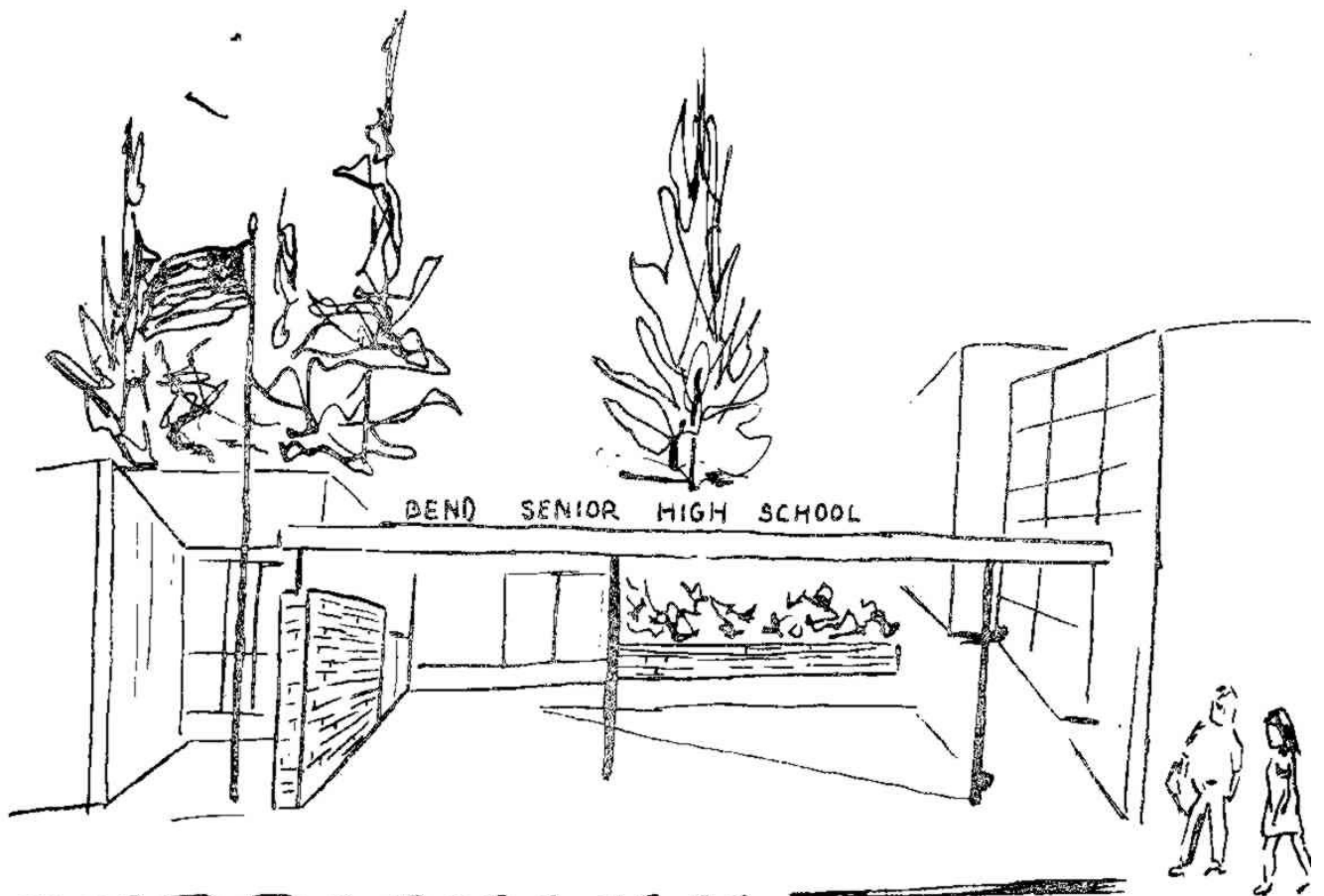

REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

State standards for graduation from Oregon High Schools are based on four years of high school attendance. The minimum credit requirements for the four years is 40, of which 30 credits must be completed during the tenth, eleventh, and twelfth grades. Normally, full year classes carry two credits per year. Exceptions are noted in course descriptions. You should make sure that you know the number of credits you need.

6 CREDITS IN ENGLISH

Every student must be enrolled in an English Class

SOCIAL SCIENCE

Students are required to complete six credits in Social Studies, two in either World History, World Geography, or World Cultures, two in U. S. History, and two in Modern Problems. United States History is a Junior course and Modern Problems is for Seniors only. The World Cultures course can be taken at any grade level, ten through twelve. World Geography is offered at the ninth grade level.

2 CREDITS IN MATHEMATICS

All students must have completed a ninth grade Mathematics, Basic Math or first year Algebra course.

2 CREDITS IN SCIENCE

It is recommended that all students enroll in at least one Science course at the High School level.

4 CREDITS IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND HEALTH

Physical Education and Health must be carried through the Sophomore year. It is recommended that Physical Education be continued through the Junior and Senior year.

ELECTIVE CREDITS

Additional credits will be selected by the student to secure the total minimum requirement of 30 Senior High credits. The wise choice of electives is a very important matter. The choice should be made only after careful consultation with teachers, parents, and counselors.

12th GRADE REGISTRATION

12th grade students MUST ENROLL in: 1. English
2. Modern Problems

NOTE: Several courses are offered in lieu of Regular, Advanced, and Honors English
In some cases, Sociology and/or Political Science may be taken in lieu of
Modern Problems.
